This consultation seeks your views on what we propose to deliver to improve transport in Wales.

The Wales Transport Strategy was published in 2010 and is a statutory strategy required by the Transport (Wales) Act 2006. The Wales Transport Strategy sets the policy framework for transport in Wales and the outcomes that transport interventions should contribute to. The National Transport Plan sits within the framework provided by the Strategy and sets out in more details how the policies and objectives in the Strategy will be delivered. Within the framework of the Wales Transport Strategy, the National Transport Plan focuses on delivering five key priorities:

- economic Growth
- access to Employment
- tackling Poverty
- sustainable travel and safety
- access to services

The new National Transport Plan 2015 will set out in more detail how the Welsh Government proposes to deliver in those areas of transport for which it is responsible, to achieve the outcomes as set out in the Wales Transport Strategy from 2015 and beyond.
